The course of International Institutions and Organizations seeks to develop students' knowledge of international organizations as a main actor on the international scene, their emergence and structure, their internal functioning and their relations with member States and with the wider international legal order. It discusses roles and functions of IOs (both intergovernmental and nongovernmental ones), resources that they have at their disposal, as well as issues of their actorness and legitimacy in the conditions of increasing regime complexity in international politics.
